The project is an opportunity for residents and associates to work together creatively using the iPad technology at each of the senior living communities.

"We know there are a lot of stereotypes of what it means to get older," said Carol Cummings, senior director of Optimum Life Engagement. "We are out to change that and think the film festival has so much potential for that."

Brookdale communities had until July 31 to submit their film. From there, the 74 submitted films were narrowed to nine in the Best Picture, Best Writing, Best Acting and Best Technical Design categories.
